Best Practices for Password Structure

- ✓ Use 3 or more random words is a good way to create a strong, unique password that you will remember.
- ✓ Use a line of a song, quote or book that you will remember.
- ✓ Add numbers and or symbols to the end or start of the password to help improve the complexity or maintain that it being memorable.
- ✓ Mix it up where you can using upper and lower-case letters, numbers and symbols.

- ✗ Using personal dates, birthdays, anniversaries.
- ✗ Using the same password for multiple accounts.
